Entering First-Year Students at Main Campus, Fall 2024: 4,478

- 49% were in top 10% of high school class
- 84% were in top 25% of high school class
- 68 valedictorians and 80 salutatorians
- Since 1995: 3,551 valedictorians and salutatorians enrolled at all campuses
- 212% more minority freshmen than in Fall 2012

UConn 2000 CAPITAL PROGRAM

• Since FY 1996, \$4.9 billion in State GO bonds have been authorized and \$3.9 billion expended.

FY 2024:

- Budget \$315 million
- Expenses \$243 million
- 58 projects were financially closed
- 330 active projects with funded budgets totaling \$1.3 billion and \$1.0 billion of expenses

Private Giving Fiscal Year 2024

- In FY 2024 private donations to the University totaled \$122 million. Of that amount, \$33.7 million was donated for scholarships and student support, \$57.4 million for program support, \$13.1 million for research, \$5.3 million for faculty support and \$12.6 million for capital improvements.
- Alumni and students contributed \$70.9 million in FY 2024. Parents and other individuals contributed \$26.4 million. Corporations and organizations added an additional \$24.7 million.
- Funds made available to support the University in FY 2024 totaled \$93.1 million.
- The University endowment portfolio was valued at \$634.3 million at the fiscal year-end, including more than \$265 million for scholarships.
