■ UCONN 2000 CAPITAL PROGRAM

- Since FY 1996, \$4.9 billion in State GO bonds have been authorized and \$4.0 billion expended.

FY 2025:

- Budget: \$160 million
- Expenses: \$138 million
- 147 projects were financially closed
- 255 active projects with funded budgets totaling \$1.7 billion and \$1.2 billion of expenses

■ ALUMNI AND GIVING

- 299,631 total alumni worldwide.
- 163,263 alumni live in Connecticut.

Private Giving Fiscal Year 2025

- In FY 2025 private donations to the University totaled \$144.2 million. Of that amount, \$45.1 million was donated for scholarships and student support, \$76.3 million for program support, \$17.5 million for research, \$1.8 million for faculty support and \$3.5 million for capital improvements.
- Alumni and students contributed \$92.7 million in FY 2025. Parents and other individuals contributed \$23.2 million. Corporations and organizations added an additional \$28.3 million.
- Funds made available to support the University in FY 2025 totaled \$106.9 million.
- The University endowment portfolio was valued at \$668.6 million at the fiscal year-end, including more than \$281 million for scholarships.
