Private Giving Fiscal Year 2023

- In FY2023 private donations to the University totaled \$157.9 million. Of that amount, \$55.6 million was donated for scholarships and student support, \$47.8 million for program support, \$9.9 million for research, \$12.4 for faculty support and \$32.2 million for capital improvements.
- Alumni and students contributed \$74.3 million in FY2023. Parents and other individuals contributed \$16.2 million. Corporations and organizations added an additional \$67.4 million.
- Funds made available to support the University in FY2023 totaled \$115.3 million.
- The University endowment portfolio was valued at \$577.3 million at the fiscal year-end, including more than \$240.6 million for scholarships.
